The Swaziland NSF:

Swaziland is on the third generation of the NSF which runs from 2009-2014. The year 2011 was the 3rd year of the framework and a mid-term review was conducted. Some of the recommendations the review was that the life of the plan be extended to 2018. Thus the National Aids Council is working on a consultative process of the same. One of the priority issues is the identification of gaps and emerging issues that need to be integrated into the NSF. For this reason, this international consultation comes at an ideal time to include the action plan into the process.

As a country the NSF is poor in programming for men, thus the priority should be into integrating male involvement in all aspects of the NSF (Prevention; Care, Treatment and Support; and Impact Mitigation). This means that each area needs to develop indicators that will focus on men.
