- Fed into new WHO SRH&R <u>Guideline</u> pub. Feb 2017
- Presentation of survey findings at FIGO, October 2015
- Five published peer-review journal articles :
 - Two on methodology (WHO <u>Bulletin</u> and <u>JVE</u>: April 2016)
 - One on gender-based violence experienced by women living with HIV (Orza et al JIAS 2015)
 - One on mental health issues experienced by women living with HIV (Orza et al JIAS 2015)
 - One viewpoint in JIAS 2017 on safe pregnancies in sero-different relationships (Orza et al 2017)
